St.. Regis Paddle Outing July 23 - Aug 2nd, 2012 PADDLE IN THE ST. REGIS CANOE AREA, THE LARGEST WILDERNESS CANOE AREA IN THE EAST

The St. Regis Canoe Area is the only designated canoe area in New York State, and with 18,000 acres of 58 ponds, the area is a paddlers' dream. The area is noted for its clear spring-fed ponds, short canoe carries and tranquil beauty. The entire area is closed to all motorized forms of transportation so the best way to enjoy all of the ponds is by use of a pack canoe, ultra lightweight canoes that can be easily transported between the many waterways linked by "carries."

All trips are led by other paddle outing participants and vary in length and difficulty. Some trips may have carries, but you can select the trip that meets your interest and skill level. Following each day's trip, return to the dorm and enjoy a hot shower (laundry facilities are in the dorm), a snooze if desired and then enjoy the fellowship of other paddlers in the lounge. After dinner, we meet as a group to hear about the day's trips and plan the next day's trips. Evenings offer possibilities of walks, reading and games.

The cost includes your lodging and three daily meals - dinner on the first day through a box lunch on the last day. The price does NOT include canoes, kayaks or transportation of your boat. Membership in the Adirondack Mountain Club is REQUIRED.

Chapter Equipment for Rent

Have you ever wanted to try a new outdoor activity but did not have the equipment you needed to try it? Specialized equipment can be expensive, so consider renting. The Chapter has 4 pairs of Crampons and 2 pairs of Microspikes available for rent at a rate of \$5 per week. Crampons are necessary equipment for winter hikes in the Catskills and Adirondacks to traverse ice that is frequently found on trails. Microspikes are increasingly viewed as necessary equipment for late fall/early winter and early spring when snow or ice conditions make snowshoes and crampons poor tools of travel, yet bare booting becomes precarious. ADK Volunteer Trails Program 2012

Since 1986 thousands of volunteers have worked with trained ADK trail crew leaders to complete trail maintenance and reconstruction projects all over the Adirondacks and Catskills. Volunteers are provided with the unique opportunity to "give something back" to the trails that they use. Trail work is demanding so volunteers should expect to be challenged both physically and mentally. Through the course of a trail project, volunteers will share the experience with other participants forming new friendships and memories. Ultimately, a quality trail project is completed by volunteer trail crews that will protect the natural resource for many years. A fun and rewarding experience is guaranteed. ADK provides leadership, group camping gear, tools, transportation from base camp, and food for multi-day projects. ADK's volunteer base camp serves as the staging area for the four and five day trail projects. It is located at the Adirondak Loj Campground adjacent to Heart Lake. You can help make 65,000 acres of spectacular conservation and recreation forest lands Forever Wild by singing the online petition at http://www.adirondackparkpetition.com/

The online petition to Governor Andrew Cuomo and DEC Commissioner Joe Martens urges New York to buy these lands as part of the Adirondack Forest Preserve where they will enjoy "Forever Wild" protection.

Background

In 2007, the Adirondack Chapter of the Nature Conservancy purchased over 161,000 acres of forest land in the central Adirondack Park from Finch, Pruyn and Company of Glens Falls. These lands include over 16,000 acres of wetlands, more than 300 lakes and ponds, over 90 mountain peaks, and 425 miles of rivers and streams, including 43 miles of Hudson River shoreline. The Nature Conservancy and the

State of New York have agreed to conserve and protect these lands as follows:

In 2010, New York State purchased 92,000 acres in conservation easements, which means that these lands will remain as commercial forest lands managed sustainably for the longterm. These lands will produce logs for mills, rather than lots for housing, and now provide some new public access for outdoor recreational opportunities. This part of the deal was completed in 2010

65,000 acres will be purchased and transferred to the State of New York over the next several years to become part of the "Forever Wild" Forest Preserve. These lands include the Essex Chain of Lakes, Boreas Ponds, the Hudson River Gorge and OK Slip Falls, among other natural jewels. All of the property to be transferred to the Forest Preserve will become open and available to the public -- for the first time in over a century -- for hunting, hiking, fishing and other recreational uses, including some new snowmobile trails. Funding will come

entirely from existing dollars set aside in the state's Environmental Protection Fund. Several hundred acres of land were sold to local towns for various municipal purposes, including expansion of a community golf course and an affordable housing program.

This is a Good Deal for the Adirondack Park and all of New York State
